Prevent the Common Mistakes

Each year students lose points because they don't follow the guidelines for submitting the papers. The most common problems that caused students to lose points were:

Generic attachment name ("FJAS paper" is not appropriate, use key words of the paper title) Student's name, school, or mentor's name appears in the paper or in attachment file name Papers exceeded the 2MB size – these were sent back to be corrected, but delayed acceptance Many judges and myself have limits on our inbox and large files were not always accepted.
